

# SHARING YOUR SCREENCAST

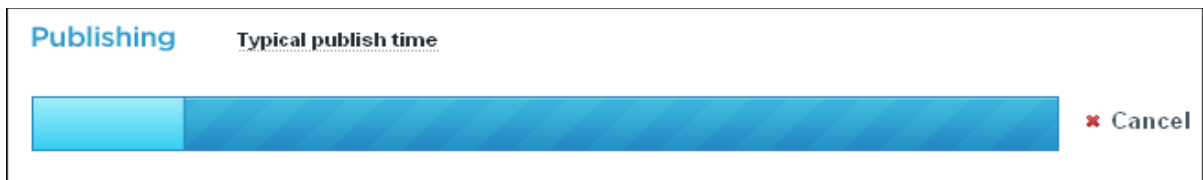
1. Look at the bottom of the “Publish your screencast” screen – in the box that says “Describe your screencast,” you can enter a description that is up to 117 characters long.



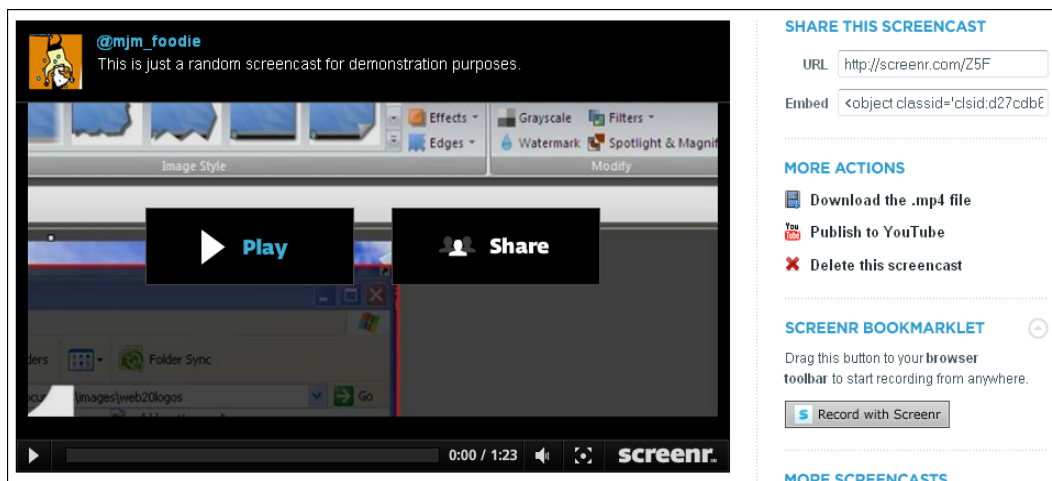
If you do not want to “Tweet” your screencast to the Twitterverse, be sure to check the “Don’t tweet this screencast” box that is just below the description area; once you do so, you will see that the blue “Tweet It!” button changes to “Post It!”



2. Click the “Post It!” button; you will now see screenr processing your video:



3. Your screencast is now published. How will you choose to share it? Notice the options along the right-hand side; you can share the video by sending out a link to it, or by embedding the video inside a webpage (such as your Blackboard course page), by downloading the video as a file, or publishing straight to YouTube:
